WE will pray for peace, and we will not make war.

WE say this in the name of those who have died, because to do otherwise would be to desecrate their memory.

AND whilst we are nursing our grief, and burying our dead, and praying, we will take the counsel of friends and foes.

WE will be prudent and pragmatic and do everything we can to protect our people;

BUT we will not lash out, and we will not visit our grief upon the lives of others.

MINDFUL of our grief, we will play the long, patient, often ambiguous and contradictory game of peace, because that, too, is what we have been taught, and now - especially now - is not the time to discard our belief in peace.
